CRCA apology regarding Child Sexual abuse To communicant members of the CRCA

Dear CRCA church family.

The Synod of the Christian Reformed Churches of Australia met in 2022. One of the most difficult issues we addressed was the occurrence of child sexual abuse within our churches. With great sorrow we acknowledge that this has occurred, and we voted unanimously to issue an apology.

We pray that this apology will assist any survivors of abuse on their journey to healing.

We urge anyone who has suffered sexual abuse through the church to speak to their elders, or pastor, or Dr Johanna Lammersma or Rev Peter Abetz who are part of the Safe Church Advisory Committee in the CRCA. (Their contact details are listed with the apology).

We recognise that an apology without action can cause further distress so we also want the churches to note that survivors can make used of the National Redress Scheme (NRS), which our churches are participants in. The CRCA apology will be made public and will be accessible via the denominational website.

It is our fervent prayer that the God of all comfort will heal those broken by abuse and enable us all to support survivors with the extravagant love of Christ.

Apology regarding Child Sexual Abuse in the CRCA:

The Christian Reformed Churches of Australia (CRCA), via their representatives at the national Synod in May 2022 at Launceston, Tasmania, on behalf of their respective congregations, issued the following formal apology to victims of child sexual abuse:

• We, as the CRCA, with deep sorrow, apologize to all those who have been affected by sexual abuse through their involvement with our churches.

• We acknowledge this sin before God and recognize that sexual abuse of a child is a horrendous betrayal of trust and is an appalling failure that violates the words of our Lord Jesus himself who said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these." (Mk 10:14)

• We acknowledge sexual abuse of children has hindered their faith, as well as deeply and persistently traumatized their lives.

• We acknowledge that repentance entails a change of behaviour, and that an apology without follow up action is meaningless and can cause further distress. To that end the CRCA is committed to reviewing and implementing the recommendations of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse as they pertain to churches.

• We acknowledge that those sexually abused as a child while in the care of one of our churches may wish to make use of the National Redress Scheme (NRS) to apply for redress. For that reason, the CRCA are participants in the NRS.

• We acknowledge that healing from child sexual abuse is much enhanced by those so abused being able to tell their story and being heard. As such the Safe Church Unit of the CRCA has been established to provide victims of abuse in the church with an opportunity to be heard.
